Access

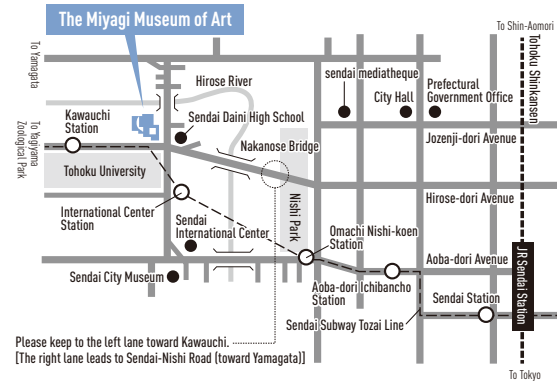
Subway Sendai City Subway Tozai Line
– 7 minutes on foot from International Center Station or Kawauchi Station

Sendai City Bus Take the Route 730 or 739 bus from Bus Stop No. 9 at the Sendai Station West Exit Bus Pool and get off at "Niko / Miyagibijutsukan-mae." The museum is approximately a 3-minute walk from the bus stop.

Loople Sendai Bus (bus that connects major sightseeing spots in Sendai) Get off at the "International Center Station / Miyagikenbijutsukan-mae."

Taxi Approximately 10 minutes from Sendai Station

By Expressway From the Sendai-Miyagi IC on the Tohoku Expressway, head toward central Sendai via the Sendai-Nishi Road, then continue via the Sendai Castle Ruins area. Approximately 15 minutes from IC by car.

A Gallery 1-2

Special Exhibitions on a variety of themes are held three to four times a year.

B Gallery 3-4-5-6

C Sato Churyo Gallery

The Sato Churyo Gallery opened in June 1990 following the donation of works by Miyagi-born sculptor SATO Churyo (1912-2011). The exhibition includes sculptures from his early years to his later career, as well as his sketches and drawings.



D Community Gallery

Available for use as a venue for solo and group exhibitions and other art showcases.



E Kids Studio

A studio for children and their guardians. Visitors can freely enjoy creative activities using various materials, including recycled materials. The studio also includes a picture book room for infants and young children.



F Studios

All visitors are welcome to use the tools and equipment provided here to enjoy creative activities.



G Art Lounge

Visitors are free to browse art-related books and magazines here. Part of this area is also used as a lecture space.



H Visible Storage

This open storage area allows visitors to see how artworks are preserved and learn about the role that the storage facility plays in the museum.

The gardens surrounding the museum offer visitors the chance to enjoy outdoor sculptures among nature.
